Week 6 NFL Review

49ers (3-3) 36-24 Seahawks (3-3)

Purdy Propels 49ers Past Seahawks.

Brock Purdy led the 49ers with three passing touchdowns, helping San Francisco even their record at 3-3. The Seahawks' defense struggled to contain Purdy's efficient play, and constantly moved the chains against a tough Seahawk defense.

The 49ers stopped the Seahawks from getting momentum by stopping the run and forcing two interceptions and two fumbles which only one was recovered. It was a strong San Francisco performance

Jaguars (1-5) 16-35 Bears (4-2) – UK Game

Williams Shines in Bears' Dominant Win Over Jaguars in London.

Caleb Williams delivered an exceptional performance across the pond, leading the Bears to a commanding 35-16 win against the struggling Jaguars in England. Williams was electric all game passing for four touchdowns, and was supported once again by a magnificent run game performance from DeAndre Swift. The Bears look to have found what was missing early on in the season and have momentum heading into their bye week.

Lawrence had a solid game but was let down massively this week by his receivers who dropped four passes in the end zone all of which should have been caught.

Cardinals (2-4) 13-34 Packers (4-2)

Jordan Love's Four Touchdowns Sink Cardinals.

Jordan Love put on a stellar performance, throwing for four touchdowns as the Packers overwhelmed the Cardinals with a strong offensive showing. The Packers controlled the game and put themselves 0-24 up before the Cardinals answered.

For the Cardinals it was a tough one and the injury to Marvin Harrison Jr did not help proceedings. However the Kyler Murray and Trey McBride connection looked good once again.

Colts (3-3) 20-17 Titans (1-4)

Levis Struggles as Colts Edge Titans in Tight Contest.

Will Levis had a tough day, failing to surpass 100 passing yards. The Colts capitalized on the Titans' offensive struggles to secure a narrow victory. The Colts defense also did not really make it overly difficult with no sacks and only four QB hits highlighting how poor Levis was.

Flacco had some good moments for the Colts who have Josh Downs to thank once again for another solid performance by the wide man.

Texans (5-1) 41-21 Patriots (1-5)

Texans Roll Over Patriots Despite Impressive Maye Performance.

Rookie Drake Maye had a solid showing, but the Texans were too strong, maintaining their hot start to the season with a commanding win over the Patriots. Will Anderson Jr landed three sacks and dominated the Patriots offensive line all game, Danielle Hunter also got in on the act with a strip, sack, fumble and recovery.

Joe Mixon was back for the Texans and back moved the chains. He finished with 102 rushing yards, 30 receiving yards and two touchdowns in a huge win.

Buccaneers (4-2) 51-27 Saints (2-4)

Bucs Overpower Saints in High-Scoring Thriller.

Tampa Bay put up 50 points in an electrifying game, outgunning rookie Spencer Rattler and the Saints in a shootout that saw the Bucs move to 4-2. Baker was cooking all night and found Chris Godwin with ease.

Rattler had a good game for his first in the NFL, things weren't helped when losing both Olave in the first quarter and Shaheed later in the game. He was picked off twice trying to keep up with the ruthless Bucs offense.

Browns (1-5) 16-20 Eagles (3-2)

Watson's Struggles Doom Browns in Loss to Eagles.

Another lackluster performance from DeShaun Watson cost the Browns, as they failed to overcome a solid Eagles team that secured a tight win. Watson once again failed to reach over 200 passing yards, he also was not helped by another poor run display.

The Eagles welcomed both AJ Brown and DeVonta Smith back from injury with Hurts providing touchdown passes for both in a tight contest.

Commanders (4-2) 23-30 Ravens (4-2)

Ravens Halt Daniels' Commanders in Thrilling Clash.

The Ravens outlasted Jayden Daniels and the Commanders in a high-energy contest, moving both teams to 4-2 records. Daniels did not let the Ravens high powered defense faze him with another good display.

Derrick Henry was a difference maker with 102 rushing yards and two touchdowns but Lamar Jackson also had huge targets landing 132 of his 323 passing yards to Zay Flowers.

Chargers (3-2) 23-16 Broncos (3-3)

Chargers Back on Track After Early Surge Against Broncos.

The Chargers jumped out to an early 23-point lead and held off a late Broncos rally to secure a key win, improving to 3-2. It was comfortable for Herbert early who had a solid game finding nine different receivers in the contest which kept the Broncos guessing.

It was too little too late for the Broncos who landed all 16 points in the 4th quarter of the game. The Broncos rush attack is concerning, with no real ability to take pressure off rookie Nix.

Steelers (4-2) 32-13 Raiders (2-4)

Steelers' Ground Game, Defense Dominates Raiders.

Three rushing touchdowns and a smothering defensive effort from the Steelers proved too much for the Raiders, as Pittsburgh cruised to a decisive victory. Justin Fields' movement was too

much for the Raiders who once again impressed. TJ Watt was as dominant as ever with two forced fumbles in the game.

The positive for the Raiders is Brock Bowers looks every bit of the prospect they thought he would be. He was the leading receiver for the second week running and impressed throughout.

Lions (4-1) 47-9 Cowboys (3-3)

Lions Crush Cowboys in Lopsided Blowout.

The Lions demolished the Cowboys in a humiliating 47-9 rout, continuing their impressive season and showing their strength in all phases. It felt like Goff could find anyone all game long and the run game constantly broke tackles.

The Cowboys showed absolutely nothing. Dak Prescott was woeful completing just half of his passes and finding the Lions safety Brian Branch twice before a third pick late from back up Cooper Rush.

Falcons (4-2) 38-20 Panthers (1-5)

Falcons' Rushing Attack Overpowers Panthers.

Nearly 200 yards on the ground and three rushing touchdowns were the difference as the Falcons imposed their will on the Panthers for a comfortable win. Bijan Robinson and Tyler Allgeier both had over 100 scrimmage yards on the day and three touchdowns between them. Drake London and Kyle Pitts both had 70 yards receiving with London also picking up a touchdown.

The Panthers had some good moments, Hubbard impressed once again and the offensive line didn't give up a sack, but Dalton's two interceptions with the Panthers chasing were key mistakes in this one.

Bengals (2-4) 17-7 Giants (2-4)

Late Touchdown Pushes Bengals Past Giants.

A late score from Chase Brown was the difference as the Bengals edged out the Giants in an offensive struggle. Both teams lacked a ruthless touch with lots of punts being forced.

Both quarterbacks led their teams in rushing yards as well with Joe Burrow picking up a 47 yards touchdown. Chase Brown finished the job late in the 4th quarter but overall it wasn't a great game.

Bills (4-2) 23-20 Jets (2-4)

Ray Davis Shines as Bills Hold Off Jets.

Rookie Ray Davis starred for the Bills, playing a key role in a narrow 23-20 victory over the Jets, keeping Buffalo's strong season going. Davis stepped in for James Cook and took his chance with both hands leading the team in rushing and receiving yards.

It was another disappointing game for the Jets, however Breece Hall looked back to his best after a few tough weeks.
